17 Mabel Davis Conservation Area

Mabel Davis Conservation Area is a 7.25 hectare (15.8 acre) park located in north-central Newmarket, between “The Tannery” and Bayview Parkway. The 1.5 kilometre trail, which is an important link in a municipal trail system, runs along the banks of the Holland River and backs onto the Lake Simcoe Region Conservation Authority’s Administrative Office. Remnants of the partly constructed Holland River lock system are visible along the trail system.

Mabel Davis donated this beautiful natural property to the community. Mature trees and vegetation can be enjoyed throughout this park. Wildlife, including cottontail rabbits, muskrats and racoons, find this hidden gem a great place to inhabit.

The area is home to a Sugar Maple bush, which is interspersed with American Basswood and Black Cherry while large Willow trees straddle the banks of the old river channel. The dominant ground vegetation includes Enchanters, Nightshade, Jack-in-the-Pulpit, Bloodroot, False Solomons-Seal and White Aster in the wooded areas. Shrubs include Raspberry, Dogwood and Honeysuckle.

Access Point(s): From both Davis Dr. and Bayview Pkwy.

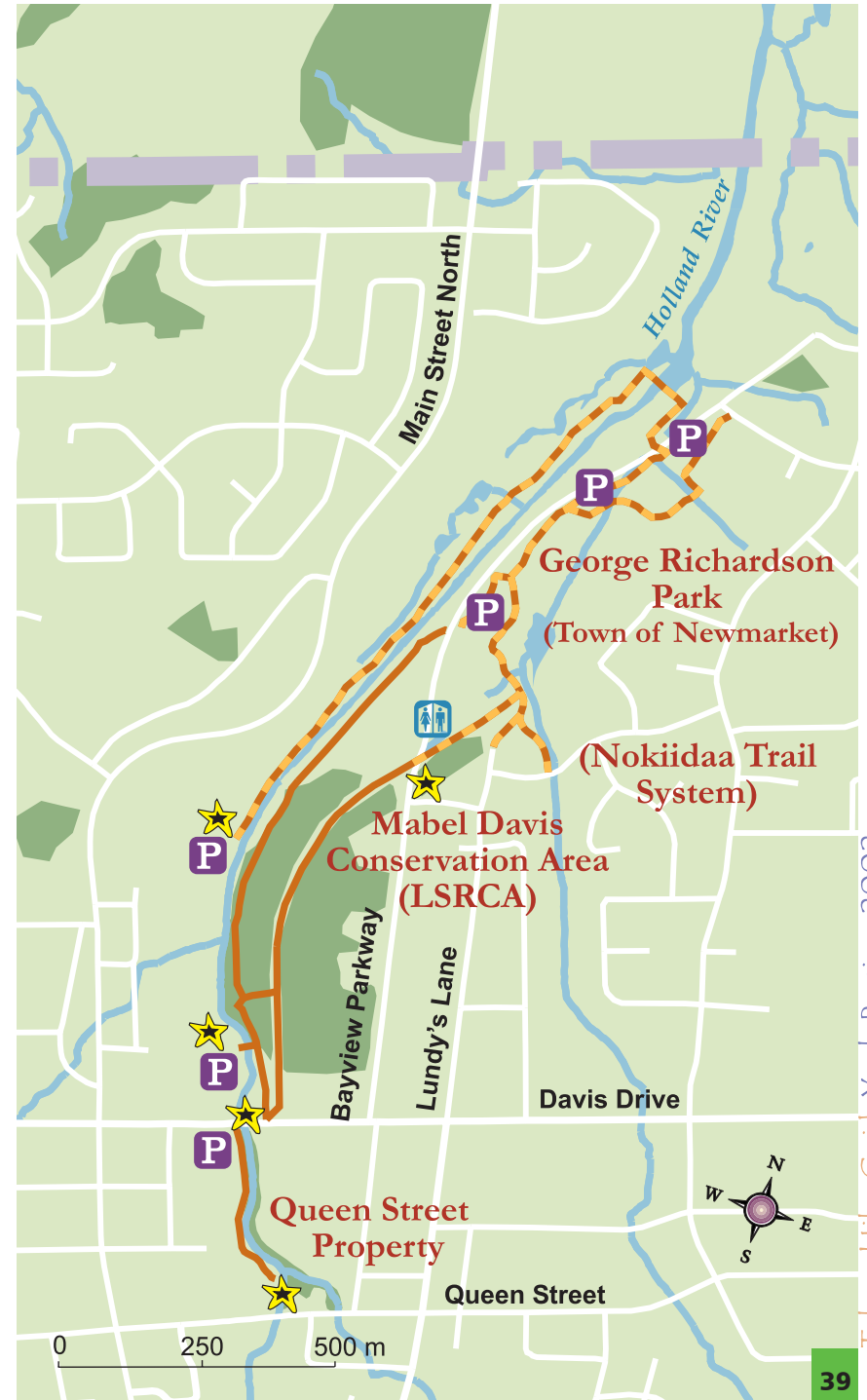
Main Intersection(s): Bayview Ave. and Davis Dr.
