



19 Queen St. Property

(links to Mabel Davis Conservation Area)

Purchased by the Town of Newmarket in 1976, this tiny parcel of land is home to one of Canada's first concrete bridges. The Radial Arch was considered to be an engineering feat in its day. Built in 1909, the reinforced concrete structure is one of the last of its kind still standing today - and was declared a historic site in 1983. The arch was part of an electric railway system that stretched from Toronto to beautiful resorts in Jackson's Point. The trail follows along the East Holland River between Queen St. in the south and Davis Dr. in the north. It is a short, but picturesque hike on a 0.65-hectare site and links to the Mabel Davis trail system on the north side of Davis Dr.

Access Point(s): Off of Davis Dr. south of Tannery & Queen St. overpass

Main Intersection(s): Davis Drive & Main St.

Total Approximate Distance: 0.5km

Parking: At the Tannery

Surface of Trail: Paved
